



Hills police and the FBI are seeking to apprehend Elgardo Perez. 19, a native of Paerto Rica who was recently living in Beverly Hills. He is wanted on a charge of using a credit card in the name of Gordon Machek, 55, a retired Daimler Chryster designer active in local chartites.
Machek disappeared last month. In a press conference Friday, Hills Police Chief William Dwyer said authorities believe Machek was
