were as much as 14 percent higher.

"Once they get some distance, it. provides them a greater perspective than when they're just in Farmington," Cherems said.
For instance, 78 percent of 2000 graduates felt the overal cademic preparation they received was "excellent" or "above average," while 64 percent of 2001 graduates felt the same way.

More than three-quarters of 2000 graduates greed or strongly agreed that taff expected proper sected one another. Only percent of 2001 graduates felt the same way.

More than three-quarters of 2000 graduates greed or strongly agreed that learning at Farmington Public Schools was value (66 percent "excellent" or "above

average") higher than music (58 percent) or physical education (49 percent). Between 50 and 60 percent ranked academic classes in math, science, literatura, writing and social studies "excellent" or "above average."

Ratings were lowest in questions relating to preparation for being a responsible citizen. Less than 30 percent said the district prepared them well for developing the shilly to uphold democratic values, identify ideals of American heritage, taking action when society strays or exerting influence in civic affairs.


