You might say "Eeny, meen you when you visit a choose-and-cut Christmas tree farm this year. Whatever kind of tree you take home, it will be perfect for

year we say, "This one is prettier than last year!"

The selection is mind-boggling at the Candy Cane CHRISTmas Tree Farm in Oxford. Trees are available in many shades of green, from yellow-green to a rich, dark green.

Some have blue-green needles with silver, soft gray to white on the underside. Some trees have soft, long needles; others have short ones, sometimes soft, other times prickly.

Size, species and quality are all taken into account when the trees are priced, according to Cathy Genovese of the tree farm.

- Prices are marked on colored tags so that customers can readily find a tree in their price

rango," she said.

"The trees with blue and pink tags aren't for sale because they're in a Michigan State University study as to coning, growth rates and soil sampling. The trees are monitored every day for pests, weeds and correct moisture and to check their general health.

"We buy 4-year-old trees from transplant nurseries and get genetically superior plants. They are planted at the farm in April and May, then from mid-June to early October they are pruned and togged.

"Each tree is hand-pruned with different pruning tools so

that they have a natural look. After the trees are cut, the trunks are again cut at ground level and a large drill makes a hole down the center to speed decomposition to make room for new trees.

The soil in Oxford in sandy, so it drains well. Although some farms experienced tree loss due to the wet spring that delayed planting schedules, followed by the hot, dry summer, which will affect tree supplies in subsequent years, the Genovese trees did fine because of an in-ground irrigation system the Genoveses recently installed.

They were the first choose-

and-cut farm to install in-ground irrigation. Four-inch pipe liners from a well 4 feet underground provide the wator, and each row has line emitters set 3 feet apart so the water goes directly on the plants. Fertilizer is applied through the water. This has proven to enhance the quality of the trees.

The Genoveses bought their land 25 years ago. It formerly had been an egr-producing farm where corn was grown to feed animals. The Genoveses decided to "make the land productive" and convert it into a Christmas tree farm. They now have 29 acres.

"Firs have good needle retention," she said.
There are many firs, such as the Frasier, soft-needled and buish-silver in color; the Douglas, rich green with soft needles; the Canaan, a cross between a Frasier and a Balsam; the Cancolor, which has the fragrance of tangerines; and the Corkbark, with soft needles.
Scotch pines have long, prickly needles with a strong fragrance; Austrian pines have stiff, dark green needles and produce cones; White pines have long needles. The farm grows many varieties of spruce. For instance, Serbian is a silvery blue-green on the underside of the light green needles Black Hill apruce is from the Black Hills of South Dakota. Blue apruce has rich

blue or green color.

When you visit Candy Cane CHRISTmas Tree Farm, take your time to find your tree. A wagon will pull your tree to the service area, where the debris will be shaken from the tree and the tree will be wrapped to protect it on the ride home.

Cathy and her crew fashion large fresh wreaths and offer them for sale. Hot cider and cocoa are also available. Don't forget to visit the animals: emis, European fallow deer and three different kinds of chickens.

Candy Cane CHRISTmas Tree Farm is open now through Dec. 23, noon to 5 p.m. Monday-Friday and 3 s.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday-Sunday.

From 1-75, take Exit 88 (Sashabaw Road) north and traveled to the Candy Cane CHRISTmas Tree Farm. The folks there will be looking for you.
