

# Daley Confident Phone Strike Will End In Time

CHICAGO -- Mayor Richard J. Daley is confident the electrical workers' strike, which threatens to force the Democratic National Convention out of Chicago, will be resolved very soon.

The union of installation and repair specialists struck Illinois Bell Telephone Co. May 8 and their absence has prevented installation of committed

BOSTON -- Gangs of teenagers began breaking windows and looting following a concert by a Negro singing group in the predominantly Negro section of Roxbury.

Police reported the trouble began when an overflow crowd of about 25,000 began leaving Carter playground after the concert, part of an eight-week program of neighborhood entertainment.

Youths began pelting cars with rocks and then broke into stores, police said.

Four policemen were treated for various injuries and seven juveniles were arrested for breaking windows and other disorders, authorities said.

LORAIN, Ohio -- Daniel J. Ronek, an Ohio schoolteacher, died when a six-inch-long, cylindrical package he had received in the mail exploded in his hands.

Postal authorities have joined police to investigate the incident.

NEW YORK -- Winston Williams, a 46-year-old patrolman, has organized a group of 40 teen-agers in East Harlem in a program designed to improve relations between the community and police and firemen.

After selection, the youths underwent a five-day orientation course. They learned how to inform residents about fire prevention measures, how to obtain legal aid and how to get help for a narcotics addict.

WASHINGTON -- Under pressure to slash spending, the Defense Department is considering plans that could trim more than 150,000 jobs from its civilian payroll.

Budget officials estimate this could save slightly more than \$1 billion a year.

NEW YORK -- The Ford Foundation has announced grants totaling \$713,000 to organizations in Denver, Chicago

and Hartford, Conn., to help implement the open housing provisions of the new civil rights act.

McGeorge Bundy, the foundation's president, said the money was the beginning of a stepped-up effort to help communities "take full advantage of recent giant steps toward racially integrated housing."

WASHINGTON -- The State Department has announced that final agreement has been reached between the United States and the Soviet Union concerning jet service between the two countries.

The Soviets first agreed to such an air service in 1961, but then discussions got bogged down in cold war feelings and American red tape.

Service will begin July 15. There seems to be little distinction between the Soviet air-

line Aeroflot and the American half of the service, which Pan American will provide on 200-passenger Boeing 707's.

BOSTON -- Dr. Benjamin Spock and three co-defendants have been sentenced to two years in prison for conspiring to counsel young men to evade the draft.

All but one of the defendants--Michael Ferber, 29, a Harvard graduate student--also were fined \$5,000. Ferber was fined \$1,000.

All were released on \$1,000 bond pending appeal. Spock, the famed baby doctor, said he would appeal the conviction.

Twelve stories below the jammed courtroom, some 300 demonstrators protested the sentencing of Spock, 65; Ferber; the Rev. William Sloane Coffin Jr., 44, Yale University chaplain; and author Michael Goodman, 44, of Temple, Me.

AUBURN, N.Y. -- Eighty-five persons were injured, 24 of them severely enough to require hospitalization, when a circus tent collapsed during a violent thunderstorm. No one was killed.

The heavy canvas fell on an estimated 200 persons at the Clyde Beatty-Cole Brothers Circus.

SACRAMENTO, Calif. -- Secret Service agent drove off two youths carrying Molotov cocktails, with one gunshot, as they stalked up the driveway of Gov. Ronald Reagan's home.

The young men tossed the fire bombs away as they fled. Neither of the gasoline-filled bottles ignited as they stalk-

tered on the ground. The Secret Service agent who fired the shot was one of those assigned to Reagan by President Johnson after the assassination of Sen. Robert F. Kennedy last month in Los Angeles. The agents were ordered to guard all presidential candidates.

LONDON, Ohio -- Ohio National Guardsmen have clamped tight security over London Correctional Institution and have begun weeding out rowdy inmates who had set small nudance fires in four of the prison's seven dormitories.

Gov. James Rhodes earlier had ordered the company of 250 National Guardsmen into the institution to reinforce regular guards and state highway patrolmen.

CHICAGO -- A federal judge has ordered integration of the South Holland Elementary School District. This was the first desegregation suit filed by the Justice Department in the North.

Judge Julius J. Hoffman of U.S. District Court issued the order and said the district south of Chicago must integrate its six schools in two steps, the first to be completed by September.


A plan outlining how desegregation could be accomplished in the fall term accompanied the order.




