

Program Needs Leaders

Farmington Area PTA Council is seeking leaders for the Junior Grade Books Program.

The project is an enrichment program to introduce children in grades three through 12 to literary classics.

The literature is read at home by the participants and then discussed in a workshop

session, usually after school or on Saturdays. The sessions last an hour and a half one day a week. Books are available to those who take part in a series of 12 for \$6.

Applications are now being taken for adults interested in becoming leaders. Training will begin in January with two-hour sessions once a week for eight

3 Fewer Fatalities Reported

Eleven traffic deaths were reported in Oakland County during October, three fewer than the same month a year ago, according to the Traffic Improvement Association of Oakland County.

The fatalities brought the accumulated count for the first 10 months of the year to 120, compared to 123 for the same period last year.

Oakland County's increase of 5.4 per cent in traffic deaths for the first 10 months of 1967 compares with a higher statewide increase of 11 per cent reported by the Michigan State Police for the same period.

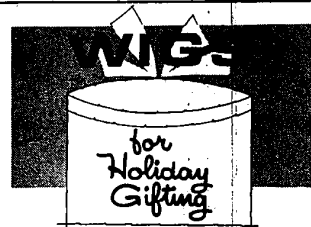
