8 School Employees Receive Pay Boosts

New salary scales have been established for supervisory personnel in the maintenance, transportation and business office of the Farmington School District.

Approximately eight employees are covered by the new scale and this is the last group to settle with the school district. The new salary ranges are: Supervisor of Maintenance & Operation, \$9,000 to \$12,500; three foremen in the same department, \$7,000 to \$9,500; the supervisor of the business office, \$8,000 to \$11,500; the supervisor of transportation, \$8,000 to \$11,000.

Hourly rates of \$3.50 and \$3 were set for the assistant to the supervisor of transportation and the assistant to the supervisor of the cafeteria.

Board of Ed Sells Bonds; Approves Building Contracts

The Farmington Board of Education approved the sale of \$8 million in bonds Tuesday night and then granted contracts for school building projects totaling \$5,788,964.

Sale of the bonds came after approval of the Michigan Municipal Finance Commission for the issue of the series. The voters approved the bonds in 1968.

Low bidder was the First of Michigan Corp. with an average bid of 5.0087 coupon rates.

Building contracts were approved for the proposed Harrison High School and the materials resource center at the William Grace Elementary School.

The William Grace contract went to Degenhardt and Daly for a total cost of \$105,460.

Major contractors for Harrison High will be: Markward & Karathis, general, \$3,787,000; Knopf Plumbing and Heating, mechanical, \$1,080,000; and Colonial Electric, electrical, \$547,417.

Various equipment bids totaled \$271,087 for a total for the high school construction of \$5,885,484.

Staman To Serve Second Road Term

Frazer W. Staman, chairman of the Oakland County Road Commission, has been named to a second six-year term by the County Board of Supervisors.

The post pays \$12,000 per year. The three-member road commission operates as an independent agency and is charged with the maintenance and construction of the roads.

Other members of the commission are: Sol D. Lomerson and Paul W. McGovern.

Staman, of Wixom, served for nine years as supervisor of Novi Township prior to his appointment to the Road Commission in January, 1963. He was elected chairman of

the commission in January 1967.

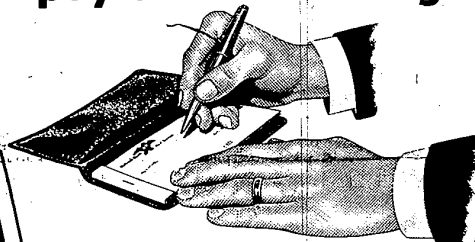
Appointments to the commission are made every two years by the Board of Supervisors with each road commission member serving six-year terms.

The ways and means committee of the Board of Supervisors had urged that the position be made part-time with a reduction in salary which could have been as low as \$4,000.

The proposal was opposed by the roads committee, however, and the Board of Supervisors voted this week to continue the salary for the post at the present level.
