Use backlighting for dramatic results

ow many times have you been ready to take a picture only to find yourself inadvertently moving your position to get the sun blasting directly into the subject?

shadows in their faces. These pictures are unflattering and most likely will end up in the bottom of a forgotten draw-er.

er. Full frontal lighting is, of course, not necessary. On the contrary, doing a reverse...a

complete 180-degree reverse...and placing the sun behind the subject can give pleasing and dramatic results. Backlighting will tend to highlight subjects and will sep-arate them from the back-

ground. Backlighting, especially

when shining through a soft mist or filtering through trees, will produce sparkling and transfucent results. In the photograph shown here, see how the backlighting adds drama and impact to these "bacah runners" in front of Cannon Beach's funed

Haystack Rock. A picture with frontal lighting just wouldn't have been the same.

Remember to shield the lens from the direct rays of the sun. If you don't, internal reflections and glare may be recorded on the film. Using a lens hood or shading the lens with your hand will solve this potential problem.

When photographing people using backlighting, you must pay special attention to expo-

The bright background will

The bright background will trick the camera's meter and you'll underexpose the picture getting too dark a subject.

To overcome this, move in close to your subject and take a meter reading. Then, move back to your original position and use this reading to expose your shot.

Remember, too, that 'fill-in' flash will add sparkle and life your subject face while natiatining all of the advantages of backlighting. Fill flash will produce very pleasing results of your backlit subjects.


