Womencenter at OCC presents divorce workshop

The Womencenter at Oakland Community College's Orchard Ridge Campus in Farmington Hills will offer programs for women on divorce, career options and returning to school this fall. Starting dates, days and times will be determined on the basis of potential participants' preferences.

Divorce can be an overwhelming transition that damages self-esteem and creates feelings of loss, anger and hurt. This supportive and informative seminar will explore those feelings, as well as the healing process. "Surviving Divorce" will meet in the campus J Building, Room 308. Cost is \$40.

"Exploring Career Options" will meet in J Building, Room 309. Cost is \$50. This informal and interactive seminar will help women assess where they are on the career development continuum. By focusing on self-exploration, values, decision-making and interests it will also enable participants to investigate options and develop skills so that they can achieve their goals with new motivation and resources.
