aggressive skier. "All her turns and carves are a lot smoother and quicker than they were last year."

"With Liz, those girls will definitely fill the top two spots. In my estimation, they're among the top five skiers in the Mount Brighton League and the top 10 in the region."

The other returning skiers whom Mercy will rely heavily upon include senior tri-captains and one junior.

Senior Dana Woolsey: "She's also very active playing ice hockey, so she'll be splitting time with me," Gable said. "She's been elected captain and we're

expecting a lot from her. She's an excellent athlete. The more she trains the better she'll get."

Senior Melissa Desautel: "She's been running varsity since her sophomore year, so she's another one with a lot of experience," Gable said. "She's a very consistent skier who also places right there in the top 15. She's goal-oriented and will be moving up a few spots; she'll be pushing the top 10."

Senior Rachel Rozycki: "She has no varsity experience but has been on the team a couple years and was an excellent JV racer," Gable said. "In time trials last year, she was constantly

pushing the varsity times, but the varsity team was pretty consistent. She's going to fit right in and ski very solid as part of the varsity pack."

Junior Margot Spera: "She swept most of the JV meets last year," Gable said. "She was the No. 1 girl in the Brighton league, and I don't see anything but fast times from her. She needs a little experience but in a couple weeks she's going to be one of the top 10 skiers in the league."

Junior Kelly Martin is on the verge of breaking into the lineup and will likely fill the sixth spot in some varsity races, according to Gable.

"I'm sure we'll have some (newcomers)," he said. "Because of the conditions, we haven't had tryouts yet. We'll put the returning people on the hill Tuesday (in the season opener) and have open tryouts Wednesday."

The Marlins want to state in 1997, 1998 and 2001; they're hoping to make it four of the last six years.

The Mount Brighton Ski League also includes Brighton, Birmingham Seaholm and Groves, Okemos, East Lansing, Howell, Pinckney, South Lyon and Livingston Technical Academy, CC and the University of Detroit-Jesuit compete in the boys half of the league.

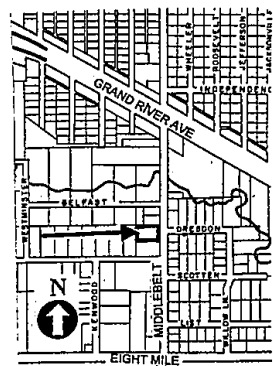

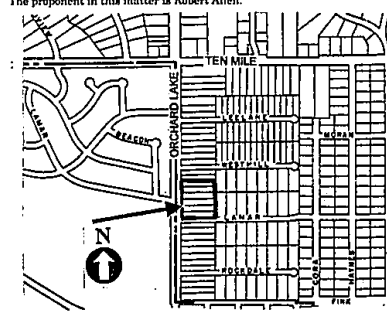
