23rd carcer double-double with 16
points and 13 rebounds in the University of Vermont's 80-77 victory Monday over host Northeastern University in men's baskethall.

Gaines (Farmington High) has 1,023 career points to place him 23rd nall-time Vermont scoring, and he needs just five rebounds to become the seventh Catamount to reach 700.

Vermont, which won six games in the span of 12 days, leads the America East Conference with a 4-0 record and is 11-3 overall.

The Catamounts extended their winning streak to nine, one short of the school record. They have made a huge turnaround from a year ago when they were 4-10 and in the midst of an 11-game losing streak after 14 games.

Vermont's winning streak is its longest in 50 years. It also won nine straight in 1946-47, a season in which it won a school-record 19 games. The Catamounts last won 10 in a row in 1922-23 when they finished 15-2.


