## Board drops school of choice busing

Transportation for middle and high school students in the School of Choice program was eliminated Tuesday by a unanimous vote of the Farmington School Board.

The move is expected to save the district about \$50,000 plus mileage costs, according to Cheryl Cannon, assistant super-

intendent of business, finance and operations. Though transportation has been provided since the early 1990s, the decision shouldn't have come as a surprise to those families affected.

"This year's letter to parents offering school of choice noted that transportation may not be provided next year," Cannon said.

Farmington Superintendent Bob Maxfield said the public

should note that only transportation will be eliminated, not the entire program. He said he has not heard complaints or objections from parents.

The district incorporated its on-going committee discussions, which include studying a later high school start time, into the decision, he said.

School of Choice students ride the bus to their home schools and then are shuttled to their school of choice. In order to

accommodate these students, those who attend schools in their home area arrive about 20 minutes before school starts.

About half of the 233 school of choice students ride the bus.

"The vast majority of students are not school of choice," said School Board President Cathy Webb.

The decision is effective with the 2002-2003 school year.

## Elks host annual contest

Winners of the national contest receive college scholarships and are enshrined in the Basketball Hall of Fame.
