Reward offer draws some response

So far, no one wants the reward money that Mark Gordanier is offering, but people are willing to talk.

The Farmington Hills resident, who is offering a \$10,000 reward for information leading to criminal prosecution for misconduct by city officials, has had seven people respond since the offer was made public in December.

"I'm stunned," he said of the information he has received so far. He said he couldn't go into details of the information until he can obtain evidence.

"I'm gravely concerned," he said of what he has heard, adding the information is being discussed with some attorneys and a judge.

Gordanier said each caller had a different topic to discuss. He said city officials will know what he is talking about.

"I'd love to go to the council or visit (City Manager Steve)

Brock and discuss the allegations and work towards a solution, but I suspect I would be blown off as usual."

City manager Steve Brock said he has spoken with Gordanier on many occasions, with and without Gordanier's attorney present, and tried to talk through his issues.

"There are a couple of cases where he's made valid points, and I've addressed those," Brock said. "There are many others I've investigated and found nothing."

He added he plans to contact Gordanier, who has notified him about the seven complaints. "If he has specific information, I'll follow up on

no mood to sit with you face-to-face."

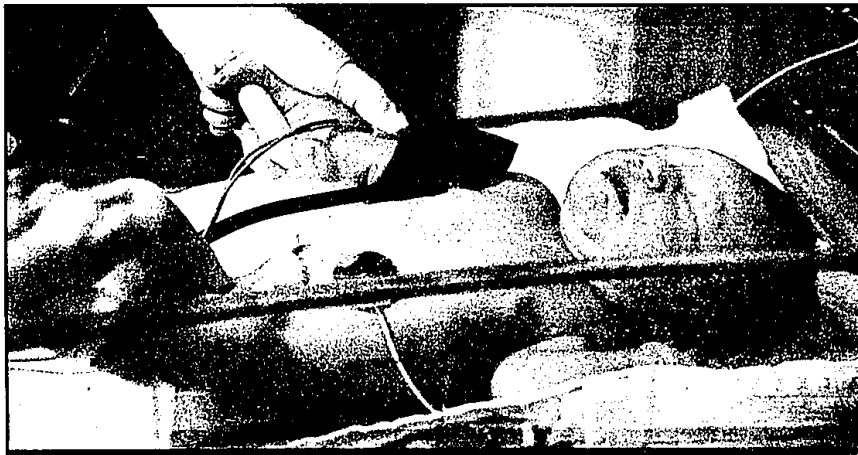
He also wrote that, while he had previously been supportive of city administration, he was "disgusted" with the allegations he heard.

Gordanier and his wife filed a \$10 million lawsuit against the city in January based on contemptuous behavior he said he suffered by city officials. He withdrew it in October after the September terrorist attacks and out of sympathy for the firefighters who lost their lives.

Gordanier said his proposal officially states the reward for \$10,000 is for information leading to criminal prosecution of any city of Farmington Hills public safety or administrative official for conduct relating to their job.
