

# Hawks turn back Chargers in OT

Farmington Harrison overcame a big game by host Livonia Churchill's Shaun Foster to earn a 63-52, overtime victory in boys basketball Friday.

Foster scored a game-high 33 points, which included a clutch second half during which the Chargers outscored the Hawks, 30-20.

Harrison's Dave Condeni sent the game to overtime when he scored his only field goal with 13 seconds left in regulation to tie the score at 43.

"This team has jelled because of the two captains - Bongoro (junior) and Gourlay (sophomore). They've kept the team together."

An Ordinance to amend the City Code, Chapter 34, Zoning Chapter, of the City of Farmington Hills, to amend Section 34.32 to reclassify certain property as hereinafter mentioned:

The City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County, Michigan, hereby ordains: Section 1. That the City Code of the City of Farmington Hills, Chapter 34, Zoning Chapter, is hereby amended in part to amend Section 34.32 to reclassify certain property in the City as follows: to show OS-1 Office Service District classification where RA-3 One-Family Residential District classification is now shown in the area described as follows:

Sidwell #23-05-476-025  
A part of Section 35, T1N, R9E, City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County, Michigan. The property concerned is located at 21125 Middlebelt Road, between Eldred and Redout Road.

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

Section 3. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby ordered to take effect twenty-one days after their enactment.

Section 4. This Ordinance is hereby declared to have been adopted by the Council Members of the City of Farmington Hills, at a duly called meeting held on the 11th day of February, 2002, and is hereby ordered to be given public publication in the manner prescribed by law.
