Top-ranked Schoolcraft Col-lege cleared a major hurdle by winning its first-round game Tuesday in the National Junior College Athletic Association Division I men's basketball tour-

In what many observers con-sidered to be a championship-caliber game, the undefeated Ocolots (33-0) overcame last year's national runner-up, No. 8. Allegany from Cumberland, Md., in overtime, 84-81.
As a reward for its initial suc-cass, Schoolcraft carned two days of rest and advanced to the quarterfinals of the 10-team tourney. The Ocelots play Itawamba College (22-5) from Mississippi tonight in Hutchin-son, Kan.

The Ocelots had a 38-28 half-time lead Tuesday, but Allegany (31-3) battled back to tie the score at the end of regulation.

Schoolcraft point guard Rulon Harris, who scored a game-high 29 points, was fouled attempting a trey with 36 seconds remaining. He sank all three free throws for a 66-66 tie.
