Dixic escaped with a 72-69 win and went on to rally in the second half to beat homestate favorite Coffeyville (Kan.) for the national championship the next night before 7,000 in the Hutchinson Sports Arona, 82-81.

Schooleraft and defending champion Wabash Valley (III.) were left to play for third place. And to the Ocelots' credit, they bounced back from their only blemish on the year with a resounding 111-86 win.
