

on city streets. The Interurban trolleys traveled from one town to another. They came to Farmington largely because two groups of competing businessmen wanted to obtain the franchise for a line from Detroit to Pontiae.

"It cost a million dollars to create a line, but it was so lucrative, they could get banks to back them," Golden said.

The group who lost out on the franchise found a trolley line, crand River Electric Railway, owned by one man with whom they joined forces to form the Detroit-Northwestern line. They ran rail from Redford to Farmington, and the reason they did it was the line then went up Orchard Lake Road, through Bloomfield Township and Keege Harbor, ultimately into Pontine.

"They wanted to find a route to Pontiae that wasn't Woodward," Golden explained.
