'Pay' day

Author impresses in local appearance

For a group of 13- and 14-year-olds, it was a chance to meet their hero. And for Pay It Forward author Catherine Ryan Hyde it was part of a series of personal appearances and book-signings – and another example of life imitating art.

It took place on Thursday at the Canton Public Library, Even on a muggy weekday afternoon, the lobby and community room were filled with fans and admirers – of all ages – of the book that has become a phenomenon across the country.

Michael Wingler, 13, of Canton, an eighth-grader at Discovery Middle School, also spent most of his afternoon there.


