Catholic Central grad Kaleniecki signs letter-of-intent with U-M

The University of Michigan hockey team has added two more prospects to the class of 2006.

Former Redford Catholic Central forward Brandon Kaleniecki (Livonia) joins goaltender Alvaro Montoya (Glenview, Ill.) as the Wolverines newest recruits announced Tuesday by U-M coach Red Berenson.

The duo joined defenseman Danny Richmond (Buffalo, Ill.) and forward Jeff Tambellini (Port Moody, B.C.) who inked NCAA letters-of-intent during the early signing period in November.

The 5-foot-9, 193-pound Kaleniecki, who helped CC to a pair of state titles, skated last season with the Cleveland Barons of the North American Hockey League, leading the squad with 62 goals — over twice the amount of any other player on the team — along with 37 assists for 99.

He was named MVP of the NAHL and was a member of the All-NAHL first team. Kaleniecki

was the league's top point-getter and pace in the NAHL in goals and game-winning tallies (8).

In addition, his team-high 18 power-play markers over 54 games tied him for third in the NAHL.

The 19-year-old Kaleniecki spent the first eight games of the 2000-01 season with the St. Louis Junior Blues before moving to Cleveland where he made 43 appearances with the Barons, finishing with 14 goals and 21 assists for 35 points.

As a prep, Kaleniecki was a teammate of current Wolverine freshman forward Dave Moss (Livonia) at Catholic Central where he compiled 26-30-56 totals as team captain en route to earning Michigan Interscholastic Hockey League MVP honors.

"I think Brandon will be a

player that can add some offensive skill to our team," Berenson said. "He's one of those players that has always been able to find a way to score goals."

"We have some talent on our team and we have a lot of returning experienced players; but I think Brandon's going to find a way to play and he's going to find a way to score goals at this level."

"You can't have enough goal scorers."

Michigan graduated four seniors from its 2001-02 roster including goaltenders Josh Blackburn and Kevin O'Malley; defenseman Jay Vanick and forward Craig Murray.

The Wolverines finished 28-13-5 overall, capturing the Central Collegiate Hockey Association regular season and tournament titles in addition to advancing to the NCAA Frozen Four before losing to eventual champion Minnesota.

bests in three running events to beat runner-up Joe Cebulski (Bell Athletics), who finished with 7,809.

Terek registered the second best decathlon point total so far this year in the U.S. and ranks fourth best in the world for 2002.

On Thursday (April 18), Terek scored 4,020 points by winning the 100-meter dash (10.85) and 400 (48.76), both PRs, along with the shot put (48 feet, 5.25 inches). He also cleared 6-2.25 in the high jump and 22-5.5 in the long jump.

Only a dismal performance during the second day of competition in his specialty, the pole vault — 16 feet, 6.75 inches — kept Terek from cracking the 10,000-point barrier.

However, he won 1,600 run (4:25.16) and set a personal best in the 110 hurdles (1:47) on Friday (April 19). He added throws of 141-9 in the discus and 184-0 in the javelin.

"It was a good decathlon and good to score 7,900," Terek said. "Except for the pole vault, everything else was solid. But I think my 100 start could have been better. I had a lot of solid marks, but I feel I can always improve in a lot of areas."

"The main thing is that I'm glad I got a USA (Nationals) qualifying score."

Terek, the 2002 NCAA Indoor runner-up and Big Ten Indoor record holder in the pole vault (18-2.75), had to wait nearly four

hours to compete. It may have thrown off his timing.

"Had I made my normal 17-8, I would have scored 8,020 points," said Terek, who graduates this week from MSU with a degree in Mechanical Engineering.

Terek now faces a dilemma. Will he compete in three decathlons — the Big 10e (at Wisconsin), the NCAAAs (at LSU) and the USA Nationals (at Stanford) — all in the five week span? He doesn't want to burn himself out because he is already qualified for the NCAAAs in the pole vault and is committed to that event.

"My coaches at State have pretty much left the decision up to me," the fifth-year senior said. "It really depends how I feel."

"Doing well at the USA Nationals will open up some doors. If I place high I could get some sponsorships. After this meet (Mt. Sac) I heard some positive things."

The plan after his final collegiate season is to train full-time with an eye on Athens, Greece.

Following the collegiate season he's had an offer to move to San Luis Obispo, Calif. (California Poly State University) where he'll receive a monthly \$1,000 stipend. He'll also receive equipment and coaching. Travel costs will also be covered.

"I've basically done with the NCAA," said Terek, who still holds the Michigan prep record in the pole vault (16-6 in 1997).

"My days at Michigan State are pretty much over. But I'll miss it here. I miss the coaches and the people on the team. But it's over as far as wearing the green and white. Now I have to look at the big picture."

"There are bigger things out there and my ultimate goal is to compete at the Olympic level and be in peak shape by the time the Olympic Trials come around."

"With MSU's outdoor track being reconstructed, Terek has been scrambling this spring between indoor workouts and going to a local high school for outdoor work."

But last December he gained some valuable experience at an elite decathlon camp held in Chula Vista, Calif.

"That helped immensely," Terek said. "I was able to pick up some little things. Brian Clay (second at the USA Nationals last year and currently injured) gave me some good advice. I learned I have to be more flexible and not be afraid to hit the hurdles."

"My long jump has also improved and I feel it's finally coming together."

Terek is well aware of the new crop of decathletes coming through.

"It's probably the best group since Dan O'Brien and Dave Johnson in 1992," Terek said. "There are four or five young guys right around 8,000 coming up. It's deep competition."
