The North Farmington-West Bloomfield Viking football program will conduct registration for the fall season 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday, May 18, at the Cstick Center on 11 Mile Road, east of Middlebelt.

The Vikings offer full contact (ages 6-13), flag football (ages 6-8) along with cheerleading (age 6-13) for participation at three levels - freshman, junior varsity and varsity. Age and weight limitations are strictly enforced.

Physical exams are required prior to participation in the program. The season runs between August and October, plus any playoff opportunities. Games are almost always played on Saturday or Sunday with practices Tuesday through Friday.
