Lake.
Funding for that portion of the project is estimated at \$40 million with \$30 million coming from MDOT, \$2 million from the Oakland County's general fund, \$2.5 million from the Road Commission for Oakland County, \$2.1 million from West Bloomfield and \$400,000 from Farmington Hills.

"It is going through the process," said Hills city manager Sieve Brock of approvals for the allocation of local funds. "We certainly will come up with our share."

Even with funding approved, the project's estimated start time is still between three and five years.

One unknown variable, according to Larry Crake, RCOC chair, is the time it will take to secure necessary rights-of-way from property owners along Orchard Lake.

"We'd like to enlist a fourth partner in the property owners in this to make sure the project goes forward," Crake asid.
