of an artificial liver and a new type of artificial kidney.

Although the development of ECMO and hemofiltration have been successful in saving the lives of critically ill patients, the major scientific achievement is the improved understanding of acute kidney, heart and lung failure, resulting in the development of new and improved treatments.

Through the Medallion for Scientific Achievement award, the ASA recognized these contributions from the U of M Medical School to the scientific care of critically ill patients. This is the first time the ASA has given its highest honor to a surgeon from U of M.

The American Surgical Association was founded in 1880 and is made up of the leaders in surgical science and practice in America. The Medallion for Scientific Achievement recognizes a surgeon whose lifetime career has had a major impact on the science of surgery.

Alcohol is involved in nearly 40 percent of all fatal crashes in Michigan.

Statistics show a significant increase in traffic fatalities during summer holiday periods. In 2000, Memorial Day averaged 23 percent more fatalities than other Monday averages for May. Fatalities increase 20 percent on July 3 and 25 percent of the Fourth of July. Labor Day fatalities increased 25 percent on the holiday itself and 12 the next day.
