# Mott ends Stevenson tourney run

In the state quarterfinals fuesday at windy Carleton Airport, Mott rallied from a 5-2 deficit to end the Spartans' bansier season with a 7-5 triumph.

Stevenson, coming off its first regional title in school history wound up 23-10 on the season. Mott, meanwhile, advances Friday to Battle Creek to face Mount Pleasant with a 20-14 record. Mott answered in the bottom half of the inning an RBI double from Thurnan, the powerful lefthanded first baseman.

The Marauders cut the lead to 3-2 in the second on Richie Koch's solo homer.

"We knew it was a launching pad here with the wind blowing out," said Mott coach Shawn Maloney, brother of recently named University of Michigan coach Rich Maloney. With our lineup, we felt we were never out of it.

"We have a lot of home run litters. Thurman alone has nine homers and 52 RBI, and he's drawn 35 walks."

But singles by Brian Shedin and Jason Christopoulos to open the third, followed by a Mott crror, resulted in two more runs for the Spartans off Stauch in the third to increase their lead to 5-2.

But Stevenson left Marx stranded at third with no outs as Schlaff came on to get a pair of groundouts and a strikeout to end the inning.
