## Gates honors Rotary Foundation

Rotary has contributed over \$462 million toward polio eradication, and over one million Rotary members have volunteered their time and personal resources to help immunize more than 2 billion children in 122 countries. The award not only recognizes Rotary's work to end polio, but also the mobilization of over a million Rotary members to work in areas of health and sustainable development. The Farmington/Farmington Hills Rotary participated in several of the hundreds of ongoing community service projects dedi-
