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Catholic schools to have combined team

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Redford St. Agatha lost its first-round football playoff game last October to Redford Bishop Borgess, 36-6.

Little did players on either team know, that the following year, they would be playing with their opponents, not against them.

Borgess and St. Agatha will have a combined varsity football program, approved for the 2002 season by the Michigan High School Athletic Association, and possibly beyond.

The team will be coached by Werner Blakely, who guided Borgess to a 10-2 mark last season and was the Observerland Coach of the Year.

The team will play under the name of the St. Agatha Aggies, according to new St. Agatha athletic director Patricia Rich.

She said this was determined because St. Agatha could have fielded a team of its own for

2002, while Borgess did not have enough anticipated returning players to field a whole team on its own.

Blakely said he was approached by school administrators at both sites and was asked to coach the team, along with assistants Gino Ray and Curtis Ray.

He said the situation presents a number of unique challenges, but he is eager to get started tackling them.

"It's something as a staff we have to work on, to make sure no one is left out," he said. "We've already held meetings with the kids and had our allowed one week of workouts together."

"Hopefully, we're on the way to building that camaraderie you need as a team. We'll have the guys together for different functions, maybe watch 'Remember the Titans,' so we'll have that

togetherness."

Former St. Agatha coach Bernie McMahon will be an assistant coach at South Lyon High School this coming season.

He said he was not offered a chance to coach the new combined program, but he added he leaves with no hard feelings after four successful seasons with the Aggies.

"It could have been an awkward situation, but I have no hard feelings," McMahon said. "Borgess graduated most of their team last year, so I think it can be a good move. It's a slight fix, but it hasn't proven to work either. Will it be a viable solution? I don't think it can be, and I think they need to try another route."

The Aggies made the playoffs each of McMahon's four seasons as head coach, compiling a total record of 27-14.

Rich said she was excited to have Blakely lead the "new" program, saying she was impressed with his discipline of his players and leading a winning program.

"Werner is a great guy," she said. "Just seeing the things he's done; he's had good teams there for a number of years. Everyone respected his players and program, and we hope to get back to that."

The team will still play in Class D of the Catholic League and would likely be in Division 8 team, should it qualify for the state playoffs. The team does have a 2002 schedule with an open date in Week 2.

The sites for the home games

has not been determined yet, according to Blakely. He said one idea floating about was to have two home games at St. Agatha and two at Borgess' home field, Howard Kraft.

"That may change yet," Blakely said. "We don't want anyone to feel left out, so we'll see how that goes. But it's always the coaches' job to help the players understand what's going on."

Another challenge in this transition is the new administrators at each school. Rich only recently accepted the A.D. position at St. Agatha, while Borgess currently has no athletic director.

"This agreement was made before the old A.D.'s left their positions," Blakely said. "We'll have to find out what needs to get done before we can go too much further with things."

St. Agatha actually came very close to closing its doors last fall, with a "last minute bail-out," being the reason it stayed open, according to McMahon. He said the school's low enrollment made it difficult to keep the program in business.

"When you only have 50 boys in the school, and 30 of them play football, if the other 20 come out to a game that's half the school you've got watching up in the stands," he said. "In those terms, we had pretty good turnouts. But when you get into the playoffs and see these other schools bringing out 2,000 people, it's kind of embarrassing. It does drag down the kids, the lack of spirit from the student body."
