

both Ecstasy, and possession of a Taser gun.

Quinn told the judge the sex charges involved touching the woman in private areas without her consent.

Martin said the victim wants to put this behind her and get on with her life.

Hills Police Chief William Dwyer said justice was served

in the plea agreement.

"Testifying and seeing the videotapes (of Quinn and the victim together) would cause her more emotional problems," he said.

The chief noted the victim expressed her appreciation to the police department through letters and phone calls for

investigators' sensitivity in the case.

"This allows her to move forward with her life and put this behind her," he said.

Frankel said the judge could add additional restrictions for Quinn at his sentencing, such as being ordered not to contact the woman.

the state to fund mandated programs at the same proportion to the state budget when the amendment was adopted in 1978. The mandated programs involved were special education, special education transportation, school lunch program and driver education.

In July 1997, the Michigan Supreme Court ruled that districts were harmed by the under funding and ordered payment for three years of the 17 years claimed. On April 15, 1998, Farmington received \$9,495,233 related to this suit.

Maxfield asked Stofflett July 8 if she would lend her name to the effort. He indicated large school districts like Southfield, Birmingham, and Bloomfield would be participating in the campaign, Stofflett said.

"I would hope every school district would participate,"

Stofflett said. She said it's up to the state to remedy this situation and foresees a time when there could be a division between parents of special education and general education students.

Maxfield is on an Alaskan vacation until Aug. 2 and couldn't be reached for comment.

The group isn't looking so much to render endorsements before the Aug. 6 primary as to put the issue "front and center" before the public, Reid said.

As Friday, state representative candidate Aldo Vagnozzi was the first and only candidate to return the questionnaire and his pledge on his own initiative, Reid said. The committee divvied up the candidates and began contacting the rest of the candidates and found them, so far, generally supportive, he said.

Gilda Jacobs, who is running

for state senate, signed the pledge and Terry Sever, a state representative candidate was supportive but was hesitant to sign a pledge in these economic times, Reid said.

Of state representative candidates Valerie Knol and John Akouri, Knol hadn't returned Stofflett's phone call and Akouri said he hadn't received the material. It was resent and Stofflett was waiting for Akouri's response.

Bridges said Charisse Heath, a state representative candidate, indicated support but hadn't gone through her mail yet and seen the questionnaire. "We need quality education programs for all," Bridges said. "This will impact all the school districts."
