Racing teen to be tried as youth

A 16-year-old Farmington Hills boy charged with two counts of homicide with a motor vehicle involving a Farmington Hills couple last April will not be tried as an adult, an Oakland County Circuit Court Judge has ruled.

The boy was petitioned by the Oakland
County Prosecutor's Office to be tried as an

adult.

Oblice say the boy was drag racing another youth on Orchard Lake Road when his Chevrolet Camaro, estimated to be racing in excess of 80 mph, rammed into a car occupied by an elderly Farmington Hills couple, killing them both.

The boy and his passenger suffered minor injuries.

Judge Rae Lee Chabot ruled last week

that the youth did not meet the criteria to be bound over for trial as an adult, said assistant prosecutor Bob Zivian. That means the maximum sentence the boy could face would be incareeration of

some type until age 21, Zivian said.

Under the request, a judge decides
whether trying a youth as an adult is in the
best interest of the child and society, Zivian

seld.

He said the judge stated her decision was based on the facts the boy has no prior criminal record, and there are programs available to try to rehabilitate him without longtime incarceration.

The boy, a student at North Farmington High School, is scheduled for a jury trial on Nov. 14 before Chabot.

Killed in the accident were Barbara Gorzeck, 68 and her husband, Gerald Gorzeck, 76.

They were killed when they were returning to their condominium from Detroit where they were being volunteer ushers at the Fox Theatre.

Arnic Cohl, son of Barbara, said he understands the judge's decision.

'I am not angry about it,' he said. 'I want to see him pay for what he's done, but we have to work with the system.'

Also charged in the case is Brandon Delly of West Bloomfield, the 18-year-old driver of the black Camaro that did not hit the couple but pollee say was drag racing the 16 year old.

He is scheduled for trial on the same charges as the 18-year-old sometime in September in Oakland County Circuit Court.
