George & Harry's is the vision of namesakes Dimopoulos and Harry Sisko, both who staked their claim in restaurant business in the mid70s. Dimopoulos first tested the Dearborn mar-

What is distinctive about George & Harry's from typical blues venues is the finite attention to detail including several hand-painted murals, ample lounging and seating areas and a mean Caesar salad served in an asiago cheese shell.

The blues is cranked through the sound system, but the music is live on stage: Wednesday through Saturday night. Clarence Gatemouth Brown, Guitar Shorty and Steve Gornell have graced the stage at George and Harry's.

Joselyn B & The Detroit Street Players perform the last Friday of the month and resident Johnnie Bassett performs every Thursday. September's lineup includes Michael Hills Blues Mob, the Kinsey Report and Bill Perry.

There is a standard SS dollar cover after 9 p.m. on blues uights, with performances starting at 9:30 p.m. during the week and 10:30 p.m. on the weekends.

While the music is a draw Wednesday through Sunday, lunch prices draw the daily customers with pastas for \$5.95 and salads in the \$7 range.

The eclectic menu features a range appealing to every taste, designed in part by Chef Campbell.

Over a dozen sandwiches are featured on the menu with everything from blackened whitefish served with Cajun tartar sauce to the B.B. King Burger with bacon and American cheese.

Entrees range from \$13.95 to \$22.50 for 14-ounce veal porterhouse.


