Final registration under way for OCC

Final walk-in and telephone registration for Oakland Community College's fall 2002 semester is scheduled for Monday, Aug. 26 through Wednesday, Aug. 28. Classes begin Thursday, Aug. 29. Registration hours are 9 a.m. through 8 p.m. Payment is due on the day the student registers.

Applications for the fall semester are now being accepted. New students should contact the admissions office at the campus of their choice for a schedule of classes and more information on admission procedures. There is no charge to apply to OCC.

Michigan residents who are 60 years old or before the first day of classes are eligible for a 20-percent tuition discount on OCC credit classes. Applicants must provide proof of birth date at the records

office of the campus of their choice prior to the first day of classes. The discount does not apply to registration or other course fees.

GOLF OUTING RAISES \$30,000

A total of \$30,000 was collected through the 11th annual Oakland Community College "Golf for Scholarships" fund-raiser held at West Bloomfield's Shenandoah Golf and Country Club on Aug. 9. The event attracted 120 golfers.

This year's major sponsor was the SCT Corporation with a contribution of \$5,000. Jack Cauley Chevrolet of West Bloomfield donated a two-year lease on a 2003 Chevrolet Trail Blazer for any golfer making a hole-in-one. The prize remained unclaimed for the 11th straight year.

The winning team, a foursome from Cyberchex, Inc. — Barry Melnick, Brett Melnick, Mike Thomas and Phil Sattler — shot a 64, eight under par. "Golf for Scholarships" is an endowment fund. Scholarships are drawn from interest earned on the fund's principal. This year's contributions bring the total collected since the event's establishment to nearly \$400,000.

Scholarship recipients are awarded \$1,000 — enough to cover the cost of 18 OCC class credits during the fall and winter semesters. More than 100 students have received scholarships via the program in the

last 11 years.

Her parents are residents of Botsford Commons, Farmington Hills.

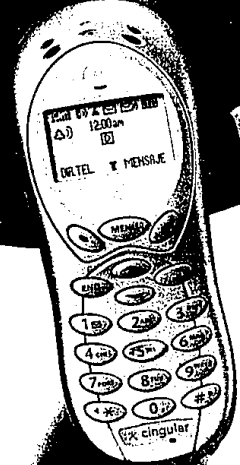
RCI appoints new VP
