

# PBA Tour stops in metro area

The Professional Bowlers Association Tour is coming to town again soon.

Those who have bowled in the past should have received their new entries in the mail by now. This local favorite will be held once again at Taylor Lanes on Eureka Road, just west of Telegraph.

There will be some differences from prior years, so read on. Taylor Lanes is under new ownership and Erin Dolbins is the new general manager.

The date of the Greater Detroit Open has been pushed back a little into November as the pro-am dates are Nov. 3, 5 and 6.

The entry fee will actually be \$40 less than last year with a choice of bowling balls.

The Storm Core Power HIRG, Brunswick's new Monster Smash R or Viz-A-Ball with a fully paid entry.

Contestants also have the option when choosing the Storm ball, for an exchange to any one of 15 different models from Storm including such as the Flame Reactive, Ultra Hot, Thrua series, Tour Power,

Eraser series or Big Hit by paying an additional \$20 for the upgrade.

Those (55 and older) get to bowl and receive a ball at a reduced rate.

There will also be a special charity squad for the Taylor Rotary at 1 p.m., Tuesday, Nov. 5, in which all proceeds will go to the Polio Plus program.

On the Wednesday 7:30 p.m. squad, the PBA men will oil the lanes to the specifications of the pro tour.

"That is a chance to bowl on the same conditions that the big name bowlers use."

All entrants must use their 2001-02 yearbook averages based on 21 games. Each pro bowler is given a minimum of a 220 score to be added to that of the amateur partner.

The youth pro-am will be held at 5:30 p.m. on Tuesday, Nov. 5 with the youth competitors cut into four divisions based on averages.

Youth bowlers may enter for \$40 without a new ball given out.

There will also be a pro tour qualifying for those who are good enough to fill in the three open spots held open for this opportunity to bowl against the best in the world for the pro's cash prizes.

The top prize money is at \$40,000.

Among the world class bowlers expected to compete are: Parker Bohn III, Pete

Weber, Walter Ray Williams, Jason Couch, Chris Barnes and Robert Smith.

Spectator tickets are available in advance for the early pro-am's to the qualifying rounds, match play and the televised stepladder finals.

Entry fees for the Pro-am are \$149 for adults, \$139 for seniors, \$75 without ball and \$65 for seniors less ball.

Solid defense was enough to make Gary Bell's goal, scored in the 63rd minute, stand up as Madonna University's men's soccer team edged Capital University 1-0 Friday in Columbus, Ohio.

Bell's goal came at the 63:11 mark; he was assisted by Zach Wilkes. The win boosted Madonna's record to 3-0-0; Capital is 4-2-1.

Szajnecki also had a team-high eight digs, while Soldenski had four service aces.

Stephanie Koslowski added seven kills, to go with a team-best seven aces and seven digs. Joanna Vescan contributed 40 set assists and five aces, while Neelle Swartz (Canton/Westland, John Glenn) had five aces, four kills (.571) and six digs.

The difference between

Madonna University and Siena Heights in their Wolverine-Hoosier Athletic Conference match was easy to see: Madonna had a team kill percentage of .324; Siena Heights had a minus-.027.

When your team has more hitting errors (31) than kills (28), you're going to lose — which Siena Heights did, by a 33-31, 30-16, 30-15 margin Tuesday in Adrian.

The Crusaders improved to 13-2 overall, 2-0 in the WHAC; the Saints are 7-7 overall, 0-1 in

the conference.

Shelley Stanton had 14 kills (.265) and Natalia Tina collected 13 (.400) to lead Madonna. Stanton also had 11 digs and two aces, and Tina had two aces. Tera Morrill (Westland/Livonia Franklin) contributed nine kills (.304), two aces and eight digs, Laura Lesko had seven kills (.429), three blocks and two aces.

Amanda Suder (Salem HS) had 16 digs, while Natalie Soyre had 35 set assists, five aces and 13 digs.

## CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE

Notice of Adoption of Ordinance C-60-02, an Ordinance to amend chapter 34, Zoning, of the City Code relating to signs, in order to establish regulations relating to accessory signs in the L-1, Light Industrial District, the IRO Industrial Research Office District and the OS-4 Office Research District.

A full copy of this Ordinance is on file in the Clerk's Office for public review and inspection.

**THE CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS ORDAINS:**  
Section 1.  
The Farmington Hills City Code, Chapter 34, Zoning, Article XXII, General Provisions, section 34-513, is hereby amended to add Subsection (k), which shall read as follows:

(k) In the L-1 Light Industrial District, the IRO Industrial Research Office District and the OS-4 Office Research District, one (1) statue, sculpture or other similar structure may be erected in the front yard, after review by the planning commission, the plans and the structure are found to meet the following conditions:

(1) The structure may not be located within the proposed right-of-way.  
(2) The structure is not a sign as defined in the zoning ordinance, nor does it contain any commercial message.  
(3) The structure meets all height requirements in the district in which it is to be located.  
(4) The structure and its proposed location do not pose a danger to the health, safety or welfare of the people of the community.  
(5) The structure does not demean or degrade any racial, religious, ethnic or gender group.

One (1) flagpole for each zoning lot shall be permitted to be located within the required setback area, provided that the distance between the base of a pole and the lot line is not less than the height of the flagpole. Two (2) such flagpoles shall be permitted in the L-1, IRO, and OS-4 districts. The Zoning Board, in its discretion, may permit exceptions for additional flagpoles provided that the flag is necessary to the use and it is not a sign.

**Section 3.**  
The Farmington Hills City Code, Chapter 34, Zoning, Article XXII, General Provisions, Section 34-519(a)(8), is hereby deleted.

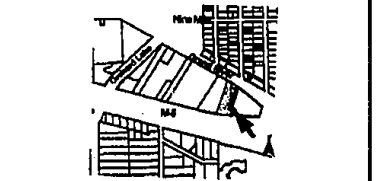
