County OKs \$129 million budget for better roads

The board of the Road Commission for Oakland County adopted its fissel year 2003 budget on Sept. 26. The 2003 budget, at \$129.8 million, represents the total revenues and expenses anticipated for the 2003 fiscal year, which is Oct.1, 2002 to Sept. 30, 2003. It includes \$51.6 mil-lion worth of road-improve-ment projects.

lion worth of road-improve-ment projects, The budget calls for no new positions in 2003. It also calls for a reduction in funding dedi-cated to the "preservation over-lay" road surfacing and con-

crete repair programs.
The RCOC will continue to expand its use of technology and innovation in 2003 to help address congestion and

and innovation in 2003 to help address congestion and improve safety. The 2003 budget includes funding for the third roundabout to be built on an ROCC road, at the intersection of Baldwin, Coats and Indiamwood in Orion Township.

A roundabout is a circular intersection that is safer and more efficient than a traditional signalized intersection or traditional traffic circles. Among the major construction projects included in the budget are:

Widen Dequindre Road from two lanes to five. Wattles to Long Lake, in Troy/Sterling Heights.

■ Reconstruct/resurface 8 Mile between Grand River and Farmington in Farmington IIIIs, Farmington and Livonia.

■ Reconstruct/resurface Rochester Road from Orion to north of Gunn in Rochester Hills and Oakland Twp.
