The Fulbright program allows distinguished primary and secondary school educators in the U.S. to travel to Japan for three weeks in an effort to promote greater intercultural understanding between the two nations. two nations.
The 200 educators will begin their visit in

Tokyo, where they will receive a practical orientation on Japanese life and culture and meet with Japanese government offi-

and meet with Japanese government officials and educators.

They then will travel in groups of 20 to prefectures (states) outside of Tokyo where they will have direct contact with Japanese teachers and students during visits to primary and secondary schools as well as a teachers college.

They also will visit cultural sites and local industries in addition to a homestay with a Japanese family.

The program is sponsored by the Government of Japan and was launched to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the U.S. government Fulbright Program, which has enabled more than 6,000 Japanese citizens to study in the U.S. on Fulbright fellowships for graduate education and research.
