The candidate said she did not support passage of Proposal 4, the plan to spend the tobacco settlement funds for smoking prevention and

health-care programs.

Passage of the proposal "would forever remove it from the legislative process," she said.

She said she favored smoking-prevention programs as studies show 30 percent of teenagers are addicted to nicotine.

"But if it passes, we'll have no flexibility (in how to spend the money)," she said. Granholm also said the state has to help the state's auto industry maintain its status as the leader in the automotive world.

"Our goal is get our students ready to become active citizens, and this has really been an informative series," Leach said. "Approximately 60 of our students are volunteering on political campaigns for their class requirement for government. The city of Farmington Hills provided us with a real voting machine and sample ballots for the students to vote."

Kevin Kansman, a history and government teacher at North Farmington, handled the mock election there. He held these elections at his former school, Farmington High School, for five years and also included the Alternative Academy. "It's a process that's good for the students to go through," Kansman said. Students used voter guides from the League of Women Voters to prepare.

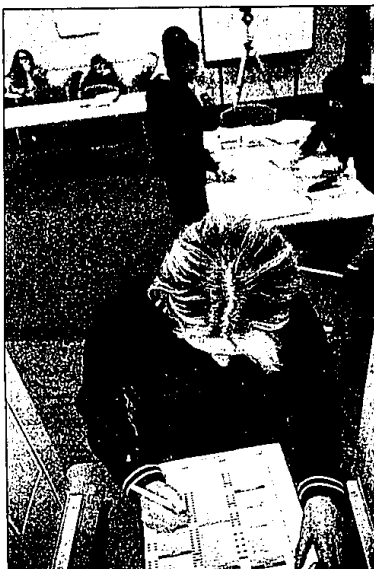
Scott Lachman chose to work on Fink's campaign for his senior practicum and kept three journals and a commentary. He's two months short of age 18 and a chance to vote for the first time. "I thought it was interesting that North Farmington voted for Fink," Lachman said. That's different than how students voted at Harrison and other jurisdictions elsewhere, he said.

In some major races for: ■ Secretary of state — Democrat Melvin Butch Hollowell had 47 votes at Harrison, Republican Terry Lynn Land, 38, Green Party Ray Ziarno, 17 and U. S. Taxpayers Charles F. Conces, 2. At North Farmington, Hollowell received 80 votes, Land, 47, Ziarno, 14, and Conces, 2.

■ Attorney General — Republican Mike Cox had 49 votes at Harrison, Democrat Gary Peters, 43, Green Party Jerry Jay Kaufman, 10, and U. S. Taxpayers Gerald Truman Van Sickle, 2. At North Farmington, Peters received 78 votes, Cox, 51, Kaufman, 11 and Van Sickle, 1.

■ U.S. Senate — Republican Andrew Raczkowski received 50 votes at Harrison, Democrat Carl Levin, 45, Green Party Eric Borregard, 5, Reform Party John Mangopoulos, 2, and Natural Law Doug Dern, 2. At North Farmington, Levin received 100, Raczkowski, 36, Borregard, 10, Mangopoulos, 2, and Dern, 1.

■ Representative in Congress, 9th District — Republican Joe Knollenberg received 61 votes at Harrison, David Fink, 38, and Libertarian Party Robert Schubring, 6. At North Farmington, Fink received 84 votes, Knollenberg, 58, and Schubring, 4. ■ State Senator, 14th

District, Democrat Gilda Jacobs received 53 votes at Harrison, Republican Marc Wilkins 35 votes and Libertarian Lloyd Sherman, 15. At North Farmington, Jacobs received 77 votes, Wilkins, 42 and Sherman, 10.

■ County Commission, 10th District, Republican David Moffitt defeated Democrat Jim Nash at Harrison, 63-42. ■ County Commission, 14th District, Democrat Ryan Gesund defeated Republican Michael Rogers 84-42 at North Farmington.

In the 47th District Court race, Annette Raczowski defeated Jim Brady at Harrison 51-47. At North Farmington, Brady defeated Raczowski 41.

In the Proposal section: ■ County Proposal K, the Arts Tax, passed at both schools, 61-30 at Harrison and 67-23 North Farmington.

■ State Proposal 1, to amend

certain sections of Michigan Election Law, passed 52-45 at Harrison and failed 52-46 at North Farmington.

■ Proposal 2, to authorize bonds for sewage treatment works projects, sewage treatment works projects, storm water projects and water pollution projects passed at both schools, 83-14 at Harrison and 72-29 at North Farmington.

■ Proposal 3, to amend the state constitution to grant state classified employees the constitutional right to collective bargaining with binding arbitration, failed 53 to 44 at Harrison and passed 50-46 at North Farmington.

■ Proposal 4 to reallocate the Tobacco Settlement Revenue received by the state from cigarette manufacturers failed at both schools, 75-20 at Harrison and 70-37 at North Farmington.
