Tenzing received the Hubbard Medal from President John F. Kennedy for his rescue work during the 1963 expedition. Tenzing helped rescue two elimbers, Barry Bishop, from Washington D. C., and Lute Jerstadt, from Portland, who fell into a crevasse. He carried them back to camp after they suffered frostbite.

Tenzing helped to photograph

"He (the cameraman) wrote instructions on how to shoot the movies," Tenzing said. We kept the cameras warm.

Tenzing stopped 30 feet from the summit to take pletures. He's scaled the top since then.

"Even then, Nima was in the classic, fatherly role," Banks said. He wasn't in any of the pletures because he was taking the pletures.

"It's the same thing like being in a jumbo jet." Tenzing said. You see the green valleys."
