Superhero visits Masonic for stunt-packed play

Follenweider received most of his onstage experience performing in the prestigious Cirque Du Soleil's water show O in Las





Is it worth the wait?

If you're a fan of hip hop you'll probably think so. If you're not a fan, you may have some reservations about whether or not 8

Mile really works as a film.
Directed by Oscar winner
Curtis Hanson (LA Confidential
and Worder 1903), 8 Mile focuses on one Jimmy "Rabbit Smith
Jr., a high school drop out who
lives with his edgy mother Kim
Basinger) and his small sister
(Cloc Greenfield) in a scabby
trailer park just off 8 Mile.
He's got a lousy job at a monstrous stamping plant, he's just
broken up with his girlfriend,
and his family is going to be
homeless any minute.
The only thing that seems to

keep Jimmy going is his dedication to hip hop. He wants more than anything else to make a mark in it somehow and he spends much of his time writing words and ideas on bits of paper that he carries with him just about everywhere he goes. But when the chips are down and he gets a chance to show his stuff, he's utterly paralyzed by self doubt and stage fright. In front of a boisterous, demanding crowd at The Shelter, he freezes and is unable to compete in the open mike "battles," in which

each competitor has 45 seconds to present their raw rhymed rap and win over the audience. Miserably he has to beat a retreat off the stage to the sounds of 'choke choke choke.'

Through some further tough life experiences, the continued support of his small circle of friends, and a little bit of love from a girl named Alex (Brittany Murphy) Jimmy eventually gets up his nerve and comes out a big winner.
