Whalers overcome early deficit

The Plymouth Whalers battled back from a 2-1, first-period deficit Friday night to knock off the Erie Otters in front of 3,093 fans at Compuware Sports Arena, 5-3.

Chad LaRose scored the game winner when he knocked in a rebound off Ryan Ramsay's shot at 11:39 of the third period. LaRose finished with one goal and two assists.

Erie jumped out to an early lead when Drew O'Connell scored on the Otters' first shot of the game at 5:11 of the first period.

But the Whalers answered when Gury Klapkowski took a

pass up the middle and beat Erie goalie Adam Munro on the backhand at 14:20. Tim Sestito and Cole Jarrett assisted on the goal.

Just under a minute later the Otters regained the lead with a short-handed goal at 15:12. Sean Courtney broke in and beat Plymouth goalie Paul Drew on the glove hand. In the second, Plymouth used a 5-on-3 power play advantage to tie the score. James Wisniewski put a pass on the stick of Karl Stewart who was camped on the side of

the Otter goal. Stewart slipped a perfect deflection under Munro at 16:44 of the second period. The Whalers went ahead in the third period when John Mitchell placed a perfect shot under the crossbar at 4:20. Jonas Fiedler and Mike Letizia assisted on the goal.

But a 5-on-3 power play for Erie allowed the Otters to tie it at 8:17, setting up the game winner from LaRose. Jimmy Gagnon added an empty-netter while short-handed at 19:48 to secure the win. Plymouth (10-5-1-1) will cross the international border and play at the Windsor Spitfires tonight.
