To start with, hold your camera in a way that's both comfortable and steady. If right handed, grasp the right side of your camera in your right hand with your forefinger gently resting on the shutter release, Cup the camera body in your left palm with your fingers on the focusing ring. For left handers, just reverse the positions.

Keep your arms and elbows against your body, not suspended in air. Stand firmly on the ground with your feet slightly wider than shoulder width. Hold your camera tightly

against your face, take a brenth, hold it and gently squeeze the shutter release. Chances are you'll make a picture free from camera movement. Even try bracing yourself against a nearby tree or set your camera ntop a fence post or car roof to improve sharpness.

or car root to improve starp-ness.
What shutter speed should you use? It depends on the size of the lens you're using. A gen-eral rule is to use a shutter speed equal to or faster than the focal length of the lens. For example, use a shutter speed of 1/60 second or faster when using a normal 50 mm lens. A 1/250 second speed should be

used with a 200 mm lens and a 1/15 second or faster with a 17mm wide angle lens.
With a zoom lens, this guideline still holds true. Just use Q shutter speed close to wherever you've set your zoom.


