JOE VITALE followed with another unassisted tally before Bob See connected on a pass from Dan Garber.

As that turned out, the See tally was the last Schoolcraft was to make in the meet, although the team was to engage in two more games.

Against Mercer, the team which went on to beat Flourissant Valley of St. Louis, 2-1, for the title, Schoolcraft battled on even terms for better than a half.

Then a penalty kick enabled Mercer to break the scoreless tie and from there the game became a rout.

Dan Beak started in goal during the journey for Schoolcraft while Herb Schroeder was named as a fullback on the All-Tournament team.

There's a good possibility more honors may come to Schoolcraft. He reportedly has a good chance to be named all-America and also win an all-expense trip to Europe to play against teams there.

The area covered by the Pontiac district office -- Oakland, Wayne, Macomb and southern St. Clair counties -- doesn't begin to yield many deer until hunters come back this way after giving up in the north country.

Some officers found the area deer kill "fair" and others called it "better than average." The coming weekend and the Thanksgiving Day period will

bring an increased deer kill as more hunters stir up the animals.

Richard Petty won the Georgia 500, although he was fighting the flu. David Pearson was second.

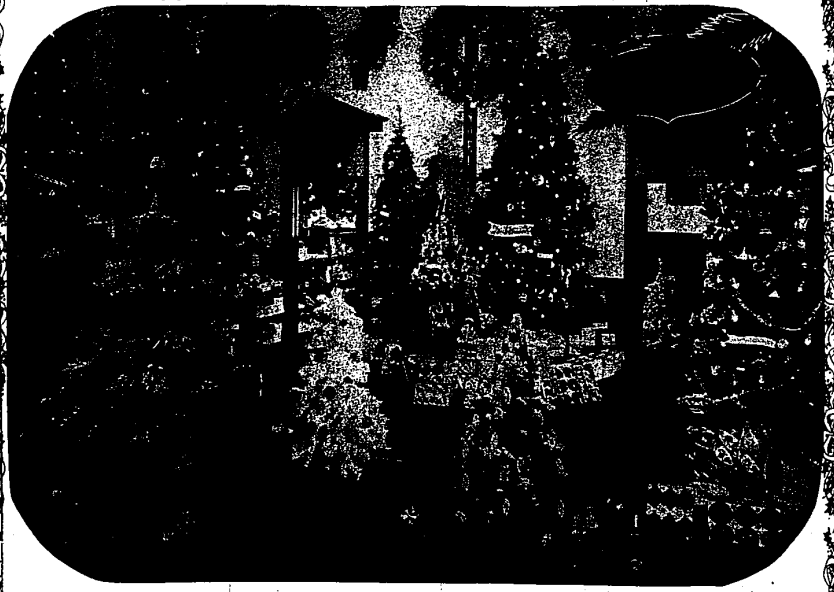

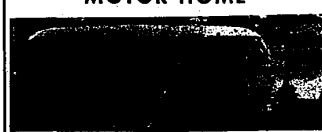
