

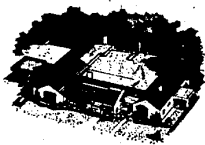

A number of Michigan laws affecting motor vehicles, snowmobiles, court appearances, credit cards and other matters passed by the 1968 Legislature have now become effective, according to a State Police review of new legislation.

Among these is Act 197 which authorizes the impounding of a motor vehicle when a person is convicted of a charge of driving while his operator's license is revoked. It also makes the owner liable for impoundment expenses.

Another law already in effect which requires registration of snowmobiles by the secretary of State effective Jan. 1, 1969. The fee for a three-year registration is \$5.

CAR-STOPPING authority has been extended to conservation officers under Act 160. This amendment requires drivers of motor vehicles to stop on the audible or visual command of conservation officers.

This authority was formerly applicable to police officers only. Where any person is arrested without warrant for any misdemeanor, violation of city, village or township ordinance un-

der district court jurisdiction, Act 147 have an alternative to taking the offender before a magistrate. They may do this through the issue of an appearance ticket.

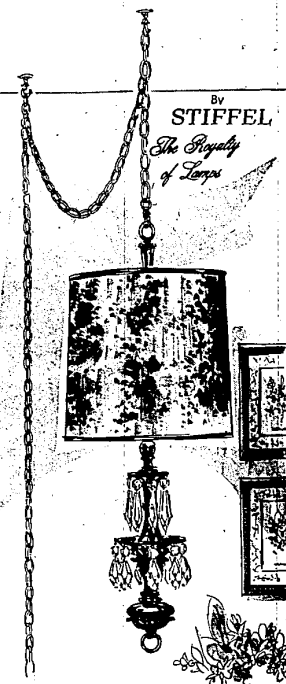
