Michigan Art Exhibition Rules

The 57th Exhibition for Michigan Artists will be held at the Detroit Institute of Arts from Jan. 15 through Feb. 23, 1969. In announcing the dates of the biennial show, Samuel Wagstaff, the museum's curator of Contemporary Art, stated that the entry procedure this year would adopt the practice of many other large regional and national competitions. Artists will be requested to submit 24x36 color slides of their entries rather than delivering the actual work to the museum. "Entries for the last Michigan Artists show exceeded 1,700 items. An even larger number can be expected for the coming exhibition," Wagstaff said. "Slides of entries should be a convenience for the artists, eliminating shipping problems and expense on large, heavy or fragile items. And the slides will simplify the museum's installations of space and personnel for handling and storing the objects. These are the considerations that favored the new format."

DEADLINE for the slides, which must be accompanied by the official entry forms, is Monday, Dec. 2. The slides will be juried by four Michigan artist-teachers on Dec. 3 and 4. They are: Gerome Kamrowski, professor and painter, Art Department, University of Michigan; Julius Schmidt, head of the Sculpture Department, Cranbrook Academy of Art; Jean Paul Slusser, painter and professor emeritus of drawing and painting, and director emeritus of the Museum of Art, University of Michigan; William T. Woodward, professor and printmaker, department of Art and Art History, Wayne State University.

Artists accepted by this preliminary jury will then be notified and asked to deliver the actual work to the museum by 5 p.m. Saturday, Dec. 14. Internationally known painter and teacher Grace Hartigan will do the final jurying on Dec. 16 and 17.

Schoolcraft Sets Experimental Films

An evening of experimental films, all but one of which are products of U.S. film makers, will be presented on the Schoolcraft College film series on Friday, Dec. 6, in the Liberal Arts Building Theater. Showings are scheduled at 2 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. Admission is free.

Of the eight films on the program, "La Mort du Cert (Death of the Stag)" is the only one of foreign origin. Produced in France in 1954, the 14-minute film is a satirical look at a conventional stag hunt. Other films are: "To Parsifal" (U.S., 1963), Bruce Ballille's interpretation of the legendary hero set in the California environment; "Pink Swine," and "Duo Concertantes," both of which use animation and published material for visual source.

"Castro Street" (1966), another Bruce Ballille film, this one being impressions of an industrial area in California; "A Movie" (1960), Brian O'Doherty's montage of newsreels and old movies; "2," a parody on art films in general and although U.S. made, is done in Italian with English subtitles; And "Oh Dem Watermelons," a debunking of the Negro stereotype using the watermelon as its symbol.
