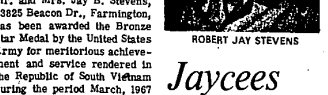

Stevens Receives Bronze Star

Robert Jay Stevens, son of Mr. and Mrs. Jay B. Stevens, 23825 Beacon Dr., Farmington, has been awarded the Bronze Star Medal by the United States Army for meritorious achievement and service rendered in the Republic of South Vietnam during the period March, 1967 through March 1968.



Jaycees Compile Listing

Farmington Area Jaycees are currently compiling a 1969 Farmington community directory of area businesses and merchants.

Order forms were recently mailed to each industry and merchant in the greater Farmington area. Those who have not been notified may contact August Barbrick, 474-0238, to be included.

Design of the directory will be a Yellow Pages format to provide ready reference of merchants and industry in Farmington. A Jaycee survey indicates that 90 per cent of the residents retain and use the directory throughout the year.

The directory offers a media for low cost advertising for Farmington merchants. All proceeds from the project will be returned to the community.

Distribution date for the 16,000 copies of the directory is set for April-June.

In May of 1968, Stevens was appointed an editorial staff writer for Automotive News, a Detroit-based trade newspaper published weekly for the automotive industry.

Stevens spoke on Vietnam to four history classes at Farmington Senior High, the Farmington Jaycees and the senior youth group at the First Presbyterian Church of Farmington.

A color movie film and photographs taken in Vietnam accompanied Stevens' address.

Stevens was a member of the Blue and White staff at Farmington Senior High and, following graduation he attended Huron College, Huron, South Dakota, from September 1963 until January 1966.

He served as sports editor of the Alphonema, the student newspaper at Huron College, as a freshman and was named Alphonema editor-in-chief for his sophomore year. He was also a contributor to the literary annual published by Huron College.

Stevens has had over 600 articles and photographs published in over 25 newspapers, magazines and annuals. He has been accepted for admission to Wayne State University, where he will pursue his studies in journalism and creative writing.
