# Action's Here -- Businessman

Business is where a lot of the action is in today's society, a Ford Motor Co. official told college editors in New York.

Lee A. Iacocca, Ford executive vice president - North American Automotive Operations, said "anybody who really wants to take part in reshaping society -- and I understand that's what most of the campus unrest is about these days -- ought to give serious consideration to a business career."

Iacocca described business as "an exciting environment, throbbing with change, thirsting for fresh approaches and crying for young people like you to pick up where we old-timers leave off."

"But whether you individually decide a business career is for you," he said, "you're going to have a lot of influence on business and its operating climate. You are business' stake in the future -- and not just for business, really, but for the whole socio-economic structure of which business is a part."

IACocca SAID that young people who do choose to work for a company like Ford can't "go off in an office or a laboratory or a plant and get comfortably lost."

"This new background business is painting for itself doesn't exactly encourage camouflage," he said. "It's been rough on those so-called 'organization men' we used to hear about. They're becoming extinct and we have no interest in preserving the species."

"You can't isolate yourself within the company any more than the company can isolate itself from the rest of society," Iacocca said that "I do my share of tongue-clucking" over some of the "rapers" taking place on college campuses.

"Enough years out of college can do that to a fellow," he asserted.

"Upsetting as the generation gap frequently is to us clean-shaven graybeards, however," he added, "we have to acknowledge that civilization never got off the dime as long as sons and daughters were content to accept their parents' world just as-if it came to them. All the progress and improvement any of us will see in our lifetimes are rooted somewhere in the dissatisfactions we feel with things as they are."

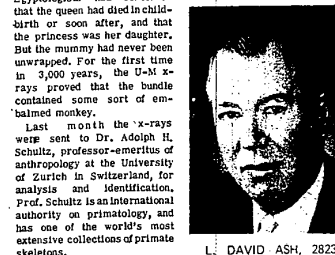
## Mystery Mummy: Baboon

ANN ARBOR -- One of the world's top experts on primates has just identified the mystery mummy found in the XXI Dynasty tomb of Egyptian Queen Makeri. It is a baby baboon.

Earlier this year, scientists from the University of Michigan school of dentistry x-rayed the tiny bundle found in the queen's sarcophagus (tomb). Hieroglyphics identified the smaller mummy as the infant Princess Montemhat.

From this and other evidence, Egyptologists had concluded that the queen had died in childbirth or soon after, and that the princess was her daughter. But the mummy had never been unwrapped. For the first time in 3,000 years, the U-M x-rays proved that the bundle contained some sort of embalmed monkey.

Last month the x-rays were sent to Dr. Adolph H. Schultz, professor-emeritus of anthropology at the University of Zurich in Switzerland, for analysis and identification. Prof. Schultz is an international authority on primatology, and has one of the world's most extensive collections of primate skeletons.



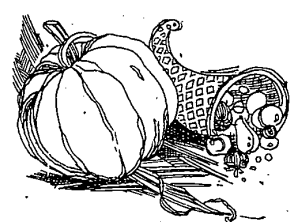
In a reply received by Dr. James E. Harris at the University of Michigan, Dr. Schultz reported that the mummy is "very likely a sub-adult female hamadryas baboon, a species venerated in ancient Egypt."

"The rather marked curvature of the humerus and radius of the baby may be caused by rickets due to inadequate diet and sunlight during captivity."

The finding leaves unanswered the question of why the baboon--the only animal ever found inside a royal sarcophagus--was buried with the queen. And if there was a human child born to the queen just before her death, what happened to it?
