Originally written as Scheenesschnitt by Swiss playwright Paul Portner in 1963, Marilya Abrans and Bruce Jordun transformed it in 1979 from a serious nurder mystery to a mystery-comedy.

"Shear Madness' is a hig farce, Lewis-ledz said. "You have to find the ultimate core of reality within that."

After her run with Shear Madness ends, Lewis-Bedz is looking forward to performing in playwright Larry Shues' The Foreignor, which will run from late-February to late-March at Meadow Brock Theatre, at Oakland University's campus in Ruchester.

"Obaniels' is no different than working with anyone cless. He's just a regular guy who's very down-to-earth. He cares very much about the work and the art. He's very fun and accessible."


