They learned how hard you have to work.

"(The Raiders) came back with all kinds of confidence. After wrestling so many kids from different states, they said, 'I can do this, I can wrestle for my high school,' so it has helped them a lot."

North will be young in the lower weights with freshmen Eric Weintraub and Austin Brown sharing time at 103, sophomore Jon Steinberg wrestling at 112, freshman Anthony Victor competing at 119 and sophomore Joey Coleman filling the 125 spot.

Senior Walter Rhee (140) is a transfer from Cincinnati with wrestling experience. Junior Matt Smith and Vincent Jamil, who transferred from Catholic Central and will be eligible in the second semester, will battle for the 145-pound position. Junior Dean Pernich (160) competed in middle school and returns to the sport after a two-year absence.

Freshman Jason Kraft (189) and a pair of 215-pounders, junior Avery Luckaby and senior Sean Goodman, wanted to be better football players and saw wrestling as a means to achieve that, according to Stuef.

Stuef also convinced senior heavyweight Greg Babayan he should be a wrestler, and it looks like Babayan could be a good one. He was 2-1 in the tournament.

"He's a strong-like-a-bull type of kid," Stuef said. "If he learns a few moves, he could really

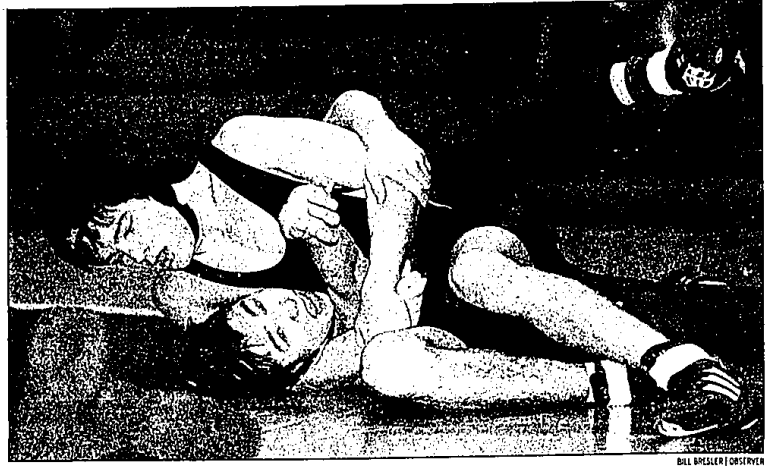
help us."

Culver Military sweeps defending champion CC

Redford Catholic Central ran into a team proved just a little bit more of everything than it was over the weekend.

The result was a pair of losses by the four-time defending state champions to host Culver (Ind.) Military Academy, 3-0 on Friday night and 5-4 on Saturday.

"They were just loaded," said CC co-coach Todd Johnson as his team fell to 2-2 overall. "We played much better Saturday than we did on Friday. I think on Friday we were in awe of their speed and skill and just watched them. Saturday, we tried to compete a little harder and adjusted to the speed of the game that helped."

Goalie Jimmy Blanchard was the bright spot for CC on Friday, stopping 27 shots while

his teammates mustered only 20 on goal.

It was a little different on Saturday as Nathan Perkovich scored twice in the first period from Dave McGordy and Drew Kahle as CC trailed just 3-2 at the end of the period.

Culver upped that to 4-2, but Brandon Naumato made it 4-3 early in the third period, from Pat Colleen and Tim Buttery.

Culver made it 5-3 early in the third period, and Bryan Genrich cut that to 5-4 with 53 seconds left.

CC pulled Blanchard, but couldn't get the equalizer.

Blanchard stopped 25 shots in goal, while the Shamrocks had 25 shots of their own.

Loss motivates CC for 2002-03 season

Two points proved to be the difference between regional runner-up and the state tourney for Redford-Detroit Catholic Central's wrestling team last season.

While the Shamrocks sent their usual group to the state individual tourney, the loss to Dearborn Fordson still sticks in their collective craw.

"We'll be up there this year as a team. It doesn't matter where we go," CC coach Mike Rodriguez said. "They'll be the ones we have to beat. As far as the individual meet goes, I think we could have five players in the state and maybe six."

The Shamrocks were 17-6 last season.

CC had four state qualifiers last year, but three of them - Ryan Rogowski, Blaine Naysmith and Chris Cracchiolo - have graduated. Trevor Stewart qualified as a freshman but didn't wrestle due to injury.

WRESTLING

The Shamrocks will be without a few wrestlers to start the schedule as they recover from their long football season.

Pat Clark will go at heavyweight, while Eric Vojtkofsky, who lost one match on the CC "B" team, will take over for Rogowski at 189. Scott Schwartzlose and Dan Curmi will rotate at 171 and also see time at 189. After that, the Shamrocks are laden with seniors, with lightweights, and are solid in the middle.

"We have quite a few seniors for a change," Rodriguez said. "We're pretty well stacked in lightweights and look good in the middle. All of them look pretty good so far."

Stewart is back to wrestle at 160, while senior Kiam O'Donoghue is at 152 and

regional qualifier and team captain (with Clark) Nate Rodriguez is at 145.

Junior Richard Wentworth is at 140, sophomore John Clarey 135, junior Mike Palermo 130, sophomore Brian Baumgartner 125, senior Matt Kozima 119, Overland champion Matt Steintinger 112 and freshman Sean Dong 103.

Pete Rodriguez will go at 215 and John Morasso will wrestle heavyweight until Clark returns.

LIVONIA CLARENCVILLE

Fourth-year coach Clint Kraft lost regional qualifier and Metro Conference champion Ryan Smith (189) to graduation along with Nick Elam.

But the Trojans boast eight solid returnees led by state qualifier Nader Al-Mooshi, who finished 35-17 as a junior. The senior captain and three-time Metro champ will weigh in at

125 pounds for the upcoming season.

Other returnees include junior Frankie Painter (275), a conference champion; senior captain Ryan Biersbach (171), junior Al Ishmail (140), sophomore Jason Park (130) and sophomore Kurt Robbins (145). Senior Justin Robbins, off the football team, will fill the void at 189.

"Justin is a physical kid who will win matches on his athletic ability," said Kraft, whose team finished 8-16-1 a year ago. "And Frankie Painter is all of 275 and powerful. I also expect some good things from him."

A pair of 112-pounders, freshman Jacob White and sophomore Joey Mihela, could also find time in the lineup.

"Lutheran Westland and Harper Woods look tough in our conference," Kraft said. "But I think we'll be able to go with any of them."
