as "different." Eventually, though, Primrose's hearty Uncle Jack comes to her rescue as her Primose's learty Uncle Jack comes to her rescue as her next-of-kin. An aging sea salt, he moves to Coal Harbours, ests up housekeeping (after a fash-ion), and decides to "develop" the drowsy little village into a bustling seaside resort. While he is occupied with his plans, Primose is left pretty much to her own devices, leading her to one adventure after another. Horvath's lively characters, her comic touches, her gift for expression, and her refreshing insights about children and adults alike make this a gen-uinely outstanding read. More fun: Recipes are included for several tasty dishes mentioned in the story.
