Left-turn signals touted for driver safety

This week, AAA Michigan officials reported the results of a multi-year study of 13 intersections in Detroit that showed left-turn signals provide "a real safety advantage," according to Dick Miller, manager of Community Safety Services at AAA.

And Farmington Public Safety Director Gary Goss couldn't agree more.
The study found that adding left-turn signals helped decrease accidents by 30 percent; reduce injury accidents by 51 percent; and slash head-on left-turn accidents by 69 percent, Miller reported.
Goss said his city's experience with installing dedicated turn lanes and signals at three heavily trafficked intersections - Nine Mile/Orchard Lake/Grand River, Grand River/Orchard River/Orchard Lake/Grand River, Grand River/Orchard

"They've drastically reduced accident frequency," he said. "They do work."

In Wayne County, a number of communities are looking at left turn lanes with the idea of improving safety. Christine Walters, a mother of two, dreads the intersection of Six Mile and Inkster.

"It's a death trap. It's the worst intersection I've ever seen. I'd never let my children mean it," said Walters, who lives nearby in Redford.

The intersection doesn't

have a left-turn signal – and changing those intersections is a goal of Redford Supervisor Kevin Kelley and Livonia Mayor Jack Kirksey for the coming year.

"We talked to Robert Ficano at the Conference of Western Wayne County Government, and he's going to make roads a priority."

lanes.

We're hoping to sit down with him before the end of the year to discuss the issue; Kirksey said. He added that Livonia would be willing to put money into making the improvements, as long as the county would pay it back later.

"It costs about \$55,000 to "It costs about \$55,000 to improve each intersection, he said, adding that Livonia wants to make the improvements as soon as possible because safety is at stake. But that won't be too soon for Walters. "I've seen three

rush hour, three or four cars will run the red light to make a turn.

Death paid a call at the intersection Aug. 16, when a 14-year-old died when the car in which he was riding was broadsided by a truck.

One attorney in the case said it was "a nightmare situation where you have two people go through a light and they collide because neither one is paying close attention."

The youth was riding in a car driven by his 69-year-old grandmother, who police determined was not at fault. The driver of the truck, a Redford man, pleaded no contest to negligent homicide charges and is awaiting sentencing.

Kelley said creating left-turn lanes and adding those turn arrows can help prevent such accidents.

"We get a lot of requests

for left-turn lanes," he said.

Neither he nor Leo Snage.
Redford's Public Works
director, knew exactly how
many major intersections in
the community don't have
such left-turn signals. But
Snage pointed out the Five
Mile and Inkster roads
intersection: "I'd like to see
that one improved."

"I'd love to have every
major intersection in
Redford with a left-turn lane
and signal," he said. Goss
wouldn't mind seeing a leftturn light at one of the city's
busiest intersections - but
physical conditions won't
allow it. He said the intersection of Grand River and
Farmington Roads would be
an ideal candidate, if enough
space was available.

"What you have to have is
a dedicated left-turn only
lane," he said. "The way it is
now, that wouldn't work."
