weight at least 100 pounds and Is in good health can donate. The entire process, from registration to donation and light refreshments, takes about an hour. Red Cross nurses take a blood sample and do a minlphysical to ensure donor safety. The blood sample determines the level of house and the blood. Hemoglobin carries orygen through the body via red blood cells. Donors are encouraged to have a healthy meal, drink plenty of fulfuls and take their prescribed medications, and healthy preson eligible to donate may do so every 56 day. Around 13 million units of blood are donated in the U.S.

The supply is used by about 4 million patients, including accident victims, surgical patients and people with leukemia, siekle cell anemia and other diseases. Southeastern Michigan is chronically short of blood. The communities use about 250,000 units of blood locally, but only




