# Spearmon relishes NCAA football title

He certainly finished what he

started.
Grand Valley State
University's Reggie Spearmon
still carries the tag around his
neck, a reminder of the motto
the Lakers logged with them throughout an entire 14-0 NCAA Division II champi-onship football season.

Spearmon, a
5-foot-8, 200-pound senior running back from Westland John Glem, finished a stellar season and career as the Lakers heat Valdosta State (Ga.), 31-24, for the title on Dec. 14 in Florence, Ala.

We lost last year in the final minute (17-14 to North Dakota) and you could say it meant more because we were expected to win it this year, "said Spearmon, the Lakers' leading rusher for the year with 1.500 yards in 291 carries. We had a plan coming in and we did what we needed to do." Yes, the Lakers and Spearmon finished what they started.

"When we got to the field we were able to take care of busi-ness," said Spearmon, who scored a total of 25 TDs and had 30 catches for 309 yards this season. Even though we this season. Spearmon, although limited to 29 yards in 14 earries, had a 9-yard TD run in the first quarter against Valdosta. He also had one catch for 9 yards.

"They were putting eight men in the box and every time we pulled the tackle they came in there blitzing," said Spearmon, an All-Great Lakes Intercollegiate Conference first-team pick.

It was a game Grand Valley seemingly had in the bag, only to have Valdosta rally and tie the game late in the fourth quarter, 24-24, with 3:09 remaining.

It was deja vu all over again. Spearmon let the previous year's championship final seep into his mind. "You get crazy thoughts, flashbacks, it was a bad feeling,"

Spearmon said. "But we pulled together on the sideline, went back out there and drove down

the field."

to regain the lead and the
national title, marching 70
yards capped by Curt Anes' 10yard TD toss to Dave Kircus,

who is Spearmon's roommate
along with fellow Laker running back Brent Lesniak.
"When they were keying on
me and that left Dave (Kircus)
open." Spearmon said.
Coming out of Glenn,
Spearmon had nearly +,500
yards rushing and 51 TDs.
But he admitted he wasn't
the most diligent worker.
"I was kind of lazy, everything came kind of casy,"
Spearmon said. 'I wished I had
worked harder.
"At Grand Valley, Spearmon
knew he would only play if he
could block and catch pinsses
out of the backfield.
After gaining 3/29 yards on
the ground as a freshman,
Spearmon's totals increased to
930 yards as a sophomore and
1,028 yards as a freshman.
This season he put up his
best numbers, averaging 107.1
yards rushing per game.
Over the summer he stayed
in Allendale, working with the
running backs coach Todd

Kolster.
"The first two years I was kind of lazy, the third year I worked harder and the fourth year I wanted to go out with a bang," the Glenn grad said. "I got in better shape and I got

stronger." For his career, Spearmon

stronger."
For his career, Spearmon ranks among the top 10 rushes in Grand Valley State history (3,467 yards) with 46 TDs. Not bad for a guy who basically ran just two plays — Thunder and Blast.
We changed our offense two years ago, it's like Northwestern's, "Spearmon said. "We changed to a shutgun. You have to block in order to play. You have the block in order to play. You have three different reads, check left, check right. It was hard to adopt, but eventually I adapted to it well.
We also saw on the films that nobody was guarding the guy in the backfield, so we focused on throwing to the running back, flat screens to get us in different positions.
The highlight of Spearmon's senior season was a play against the University of Indianapolis. He was running a sweep to the corner of the end zone when a defender lined him up.
