Cusac named Hills top firefighter

You could say Paul Cusac has firefighting in his blood. His dad was a paid on-call firefighter for Farmington Township back in the early 1950s and it wasn't unusual for Cusac and his siblings to taken along on runs. "Back then, you brought your kids along for things like grass fires," said Cusac, a carree firefighter with Farmington Hills. 'He wouldn't let us go on house fire runs."

That was in the days when the tiny township had only about 100 fire department

calls a year, compared with 6,500 today.

Cusae was named Firefighter of the Year at the annual Farmington Hills Fire Department award ceremony. Held Pridge at Vladimirs.

It was a shock to me. Cusae said of the honor. The award recipient was not announced until the very end of the ceremony. I didn't think anything I did was more than normal. "He's a consummate team player. He's one of the most dedicated people to our cause," the chief said.

Cusae was a paid, on-call firefighter from 1974 to 2001 and became a career firefighter in 1977.
