Western retail pioneer Scott Colburn dies

After a decade of living with Alzheimer's disease, local busi-nessman Scott O. Colburn, age 85, died on January 19, sur-rounded by his wife, Marjorie and children, friends and exte-riors.

Working with wife Marjorie, who was also his dance partner, he quickly became one of Michigans most popular square dance leaders. He started out selling square and fulk dance records at dances in the 1940s and expanded to square dance attire with a Detroit storefront in 1951. The business moved to a largar location in northwest Detroit in 1959, and siy years later, the store moved to downtown Farmington, adding horse equipment and boots to the inventory mix. In 1979, he relized his goal of building his own store with a final move to Livonia. The 22-year-old family business continuer in operation under the management of daughter Sarah Colburn.
