They have been super excit-ed, "McDermid said. Children learn to use the hand heids quicker because they aren't afraid of them like adults," McGela said. They'ee grown up with romputers. They'eist how it. There's 15,000 programs written for hand heids, he said. About eight to 10 district teachers have explored ways to use hand-heids computers regu-larly in the district including through the teachnology budget. The district allows for a match-ing building technology grant. Some grants, such as one expected to put the computers into the hands of every Berrien Ocumy seventh-grader, aren't available to the Farmington district because it's considered too affluent, Nedela said. Nedela will train staff Fcb. 10 at the Farmington Training Center and will give a presen-tation at Plymouth Salem High School Fcb. 27.
